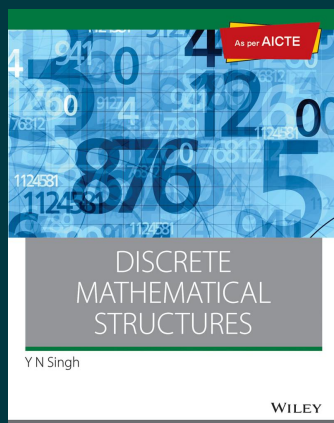




Discrete Mathematical Structures, As per AICTE
